



Lightning Protection Institute Inspection Program



Did you know that the LPI-IP offers a lightning protection installation inspection program tailored specifically for customers with multiple buildings?



The Campus Re-Inspection Program is available for sites having four or more buildings in a local area that require recertification of their lightning protection systems.

In response to industry request, the LPI-IP has developed the Campus Re-Inspection Program. This program was meticulously designed to provide an easy, cost effective way for institutions with multiple buildings to ensure their lightning protection systems are well maintained and comply with the latest changes to lightning protection standards.

After receiving an initial certification, the LPI-IP will work with the owner and a local lightning protection contractor to create a custom, on-going maintenance and inspection plan for the systems. Best of all, this opportunity is not just open to school campuses, but hospital, manufacturing plants, or any other organization with four or more buildings as well.

Campus Re-Inspection Program Requirements

In order to ensure the same caliber of certification for the Campus Re-Inspection Program that the LPI-IP maintains for the rest of its services, the requirements below must be fulfilled to obtain certification.

All buildings must have been previously certified.

All buildings must be owned by the institution where the campus is located.

All buildings must be located on a single campus (i.e. no remote sites).

Campus employees will be trained as inspectors and must complete an LPI-IP training program.

An LPI Dealer Contractor must be present during re-inspections to obtain certification.

Any deviations noted during the re-inspection must be corrected by an LPI Dealer Contractor under the supervision of an LPI Master Installer.

The LPI Dealer Contractor used must meet the current requirements of the LPI-IP and is responsible for submission of all applications and certification requests.

Certificates are valid for three years (unless otherwise voided). Systems may be recertified three times under the Campus Re-inspection Program.

After three consecutive certifications under the Campus Re-inspection Program, the system must obtain a new LPI-IP Master Installation Certificate.

If buildings are re-roofed, they must obtain a new LPI-IP Reconditioned Master Installation Certificate.

If buildings have an addition built, changing the footprint of the structure, the addition must obtain a new LPI-IP limited scope inspection at minimum.

It is the responsibility of the campus inspector to notify the LPI-IP office and/or the LPI Dealer Contractor of any deviations during the term of an issued certificate.
